The Southeast Michigan Land Conservancy (SMLC) seeks to contract a motivated and experienced Nature Preserve Monitor to fulfill annual monitoring requirements for 12–14 of SMLC's 18 nature preserves. This position will require travel to nature preserves for field work as well as office-based work at the Conservancy Farm in Superior Township. The Monitor reports to and works with the SOS to fulfill Land Trust Alliance requirements for annual nature preserve monitoring.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Implement preserve monitoring protocol for 12–14 of SMLC's nature preserves (NP) throughout the 7-county region of Southeast Michigan:

- o Independently assess and monitor NPs.
- Collect information (photos, GPS points, and notes) on natural and cultural features during site visits and record using the SMLC Site Monitoring Form.
- O Complete monitoring reports for each preserve that clearly and concisely document observations made on site along with associated concerns and recommendations.
 - Using ArcGIS, create a monitoring map for each preserve.
 - Discuss monitoring results with the SOS before the reports are finalized.
- Note: possible additional work depending on qualifications collect information from designated SMLC volunteer monitors and prepare monitoring reports as noted above.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- ✓ Strong written, oral and interpersonal communication skills.
- ✓ Experience / desire to work independently in the field and office.
- ✓ Willingness to take direction, incorporate feedback, and produce periodic results in a timely manner.
- ✓ Good organizational and record keeping skills.
- ✓ Ability to traverse varied terrain on foot, in inclement weather.
- ✓ 2+ years of coursework towards a degree in natural resource management, conservation planning or related field.
- ✓ A personal smartphone capable of navigation and taking photos.

- ✓ Proficiency using Microsoft Office suite.
- ✓ A valid driver's license and a licensed, insured vehicle.
